Fill in all forms completely. Make sure identification cards are securely fastened to the backs of works submitted. Entry forms may be duplicated. **A self-addressed stamped envelope or an email address must be included for notification.**

Sale of Work:

Please indicate whether or not your work is for sale. Work is sold at the price listed on the form. The Guild will receive a 30% commission on all work sold. The Guild will add required NYS sales tax on all gallery sales. Exhibited work not sold must be picked up by the artist on the pick-up dates listed below.

Cash Awards:

The juror will determine the number of works to be awarded cash prizes and Honorable Mentions in the exhibit.

- \$20 entry fee for one or two works; \$5 for one additional work
- Labels attached to backs of each piece

Eligibility:

This competition is open to all artists. There is no specific theme. Please submit original art including: ceramics, drawing, fiber, jewelry, painting, photography, printmaking, and sculpture. Prizes and awards to be determined by the juror. Two dimensional work must not exceed 34" in any dimension and must be framed or wired for hanging. Clip hangers will not be accepted. Three dimensional work must be of a reasonable size for a small gallery. No work done in class or under supervision may be submitted.

Entries:

Work should be hand delivered to the Adirondack Artists' Guild Gallery during regular hours. A non-refundable entry fee of \$25 for two works, with the submission of a third work optional for an additional \$5, must accompany entries. Make check or money order payable to "Adirondack Artists' Guild". Notification of the juror's decision will be mailed or emailed March 2nd.
